Dear friends,

Growing up in New York during the 1950s turned me into a lover of Broadway theatre, especially musicals. By the age of 18, I'd been fortunate enough to see wonderful productions of *West Side Story, My Fair Lady*, and close to a hundred other musicals, dramas and comedies.

My very favorite musical turned out to be *Kismet* which opened on Broadway in 1953 and won a Tony Award in 1954 for best musical. Over the years, the music and the words have often played in my head and seemed to be calling out to me with a special message. For most of the last decade, I have had a burning desire to see *Kismet* once again live and on stage. I missed the songs and the splendor, the music and the magic!

After my 75th birthday, I realized that I should perhaps visualize what I had for so long considered an "Impossible Dream" (thinking of yet another favorite musical, Man of La Mancha). Kismet was so wonderful, yet rarely performed, and I wanted to share its beautiful melodies, witty lyrics, splendid costumes, and amazing opportunities for active and beautiful dances. I believed that our own Symphony and Ballet companies could showcase their amazing strengths to us—especially if they could have the advantage of input from a great director and the 6 leading roles played by strong, experienced Broadway talent.

I decided that I would bring Broadway to Santa Barbara with a live and beautifully staged production of this wonderful show with the leading roles played by Broadway talent, the music provided by Santa Barbara's Symphony, and newly choreographed dances performed by our very own, and much beloved State Street Ballet I discussed this idea with my friend, Tony Award-winning Broadway producer Ken Davenport, who agreed to sign on as Executive Producer. We recruited Broadway director Lonny Price who has worked with some of my favorite Broadway stars including Audra McDonald, Norm Lewis, Patti LuPone, Emma Thompson and Glenn Close, Lonny and I had dinner at the Russian Tea Room in New York a year and a half ago and decided to plan this production to celebrate my 80th birthday in February of 2021.

When Covid-19 came along, of course our plans for *Kismet* had to be rescheduled. My 80th birthday is being celebrated during the entire year of 2021, rather than just February, so we moved our production forward to October of this year as a treat for myself, my friends, and my community, as we emerge (somewhat shell-shocked) from the pandemic and begin to create the "new normal" of whatever changes will follow with work, education, and how we live our lives in a post-COVID period!

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# FROM THE DIRECTOR



Welcome to Kismet!

Kismet is a musical comedy that was produced on Broadway in 1953. It starred Alfred Drake who had wowed audiences playing

Curley in the original Oklahoma!, and then again some years later as the lead in Cole Porter's Kiss Me Kate. Adapted from the Edward Knoblock play of the same name, Kismet has a book by Luther Davis & Charles Lederer and songs by George Wright & Robert Forrest. What is most unusual about Kismet is that Wright & Forrest based their score on the themes of classical composer Alexander Borodin. How they managed to turn these classical themes into some of the most ravishing and popular songs ever heard on a Broadway stage is still a mystery to me. I can't think of any other musical dramatists that ever attempted this particular feat. The songs "Baubles Bangles and Beads," "Stranger in Paradise," "And This Is My Beloved" have become part of the fabric of the American song book, sung by countless great singers through the decades—Frank Sinatra, Sarah Vaughn, and Antonio Carlos Jobim, to name a few. The show won the 1954 Tony Award as Best Musical, along with Mr. Drake and the conductor Louis Adrian taking home Tonys as well.

What's important to note is that up through the 1950's, songs from Broadway shows were a major part of popular music. And in fact, cast albums were on the record charts—Lerner and Loewe's *My Fair Lady* spent a whopping 480 weeks on the Billboard charts! All to say that the songs were the most important element of a show, and frequently the driving force, since they would have a life outside of the theatre and generate income for years to come. Many

of the shows that housed those songs are unrevivable, hampered by books hastily constructed to accommodate the tunes—the shows were never meant to have an afterlife much beyond their time. (Rodgers and Hammerstein musicals are an exception.) In terms of accuracy in depicting places and cultures outside of the US, the writing was often spotty at best, with seemingly little attention placed on any kind of authenticity.

Happily, we are now in an era where respectful representation of cultures is imperative, which is vital, important and utterly correct. When working on a show such as this, as much as one has to understand the time in which it was written, one cannot continue to perpetuate stereotypes and tropes that have caused pain to a group—any group—of people.

In approaching *Kismet*, we reached out to Professor Naila Al-Atrash, Professor of Arab Theater and Film Studies at NYU for her guidance on the material. We made what we hope are substantial adjustments (including some cuts) in our effort to be fully respectful of the extraordinary culture this show celebrates. Interestingly, among many other significant things, Persians gave us the concept of Human Rights.

I think we are living in an exciting time. A time when we are more aware of our lack of sensitivity to members of our communities, and a time when we are making commitments to do better. And I am hopeful we will.

Now sit back and let this ravishing music, singing, and dancing transport you to our Arabian Night fantasy. I hope you enjoy the show!

ROBERT WRIGHT (Music & Lyrics) born September 25, 1914, (Daytona Beach) died Wednesday August 2, 2005 (Miami) and George Chet Forrest (Music & Lyrics) born July 31, 1915 (Brooklyn), died Oct. 10, 1999 (Miami) wrote together in the longest continual partnership in the history of musical theatre. They got their start in Hollywood and were equally comfortable writing for the screen or stage. Their most famous musical is Kismet, in which they adapted the musical themes of Alexander Borodin creating a theatrical score filled with songs that became timeless hits including Baubles, Bangles and Beads, Stranger In Paradise, and And This Is My Beloved. Several of their works used classical compositions adapted into song form. Their works for the stage include: Song Of Norway (1944) (music adapted from Edvard Grieg), Gypsy Lady (1946) (music adapted from Victor Herbert), Magdalena (1948) (original music by Heitor Villa-Lobos), Kismet (1953) (music adapted from Alexander Borodin), Kean (1961), Anya (1965) (music adapted from Sergei Rachmaninoff), The Great Waltz (1970) (music adapted from Johann Strauss), Timbuktu! (1978) (reworking of Kismet), and Grand Hotel The Musical (1989).

LONNY PRICE (Director) On Broadway, Lonny directed Glenn Close in Sunset Blvd (also at the English National Opera) and Lady Day At Emerson's Bar And Grill starring Audra McDonald (also the film version for HBO, as well as on the West End). Other New York productions include Sweeney Todd starring Emma Thompson and Bryn Terfel, Company (starring Neil Patrick Harris, Stephen Colbert), Sondheim: The Birthday Concert (Emmy Award), Passion (Emmy Award), and Candide (starring Patti LuPone and Kristen Chenoweth). Other Broadway work includes 110 in the Shade; 'Master Harold'... and the Boys; Sally Marr and Her Escorts (which he co-wrote with Joan Rivers and Erin Sanders); Urban Cowboy; and A Class Act, for which he also co-wrote the book with Linda Kline and was nominated for a Tony Award. He

directed the documentaries "Hal Prince: The Director's Life" (for Great Performances) and "The Best Worst Thing That Ever Could Have Happened" which played the New York Film Festival, and is currently available on Netflix. Happy Birthday, SMM!

NIR KABARETTI (Conductor) Internationally acclaimed conductor Nir Kabaretti's artistic reach continues to expand around the world, thrilling audiences with his dynamic conducting style and vast knowledge of all facets of musical performing arts. Since joining Santa Barbara Symphony in 2005, Maestro Kabaretti has propelled the Symphony to new artistic heights, attracting the world's top musician talent as orchestra members and renowned guest artists, and engaging capacity audiences in his artistic vision of dynamic and diverse performances.

WILLIAM SOLEAU (Choreographer) has created over 100 ballets on companies around the world. Upon his graduation from the prestigious University of Music and Performing Arts in Vienna, Kabaretti began working as coach and chorus master at the Vienna State Opera and the Salzburg Festival. He subsequently advanced to positions as assistant to the Music Director at the Teatro Real in Madrid and personal assistant to Maestro Zubin Mehta at Teatro del Maggio Musicale in Florence, Italy. He collaborated with some of the world's most distinguished conductors of the time, including Claudio Abbado, Lorin Maazel, Seiji Ozawa, Valery Gergiev, and Riccardo Muti

He received the America-Israel Cultural Foundation Grant for Young Conductors and won the Forum Junger Künstler Conducting Competition



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

# THE GRANADA THEATRE

# MISSION

The Granada Theatre, owned and operated by the Santa Barbara Center for the Performing Arts, serves Santa Barbara by providing a vibrant, state-of-the-art venue where world-class artistic performances are available to the widest possible audience, promoting appreciation for the performing arts and enhancing the quality of life in our community.

# **ABOUT**

A local landmark for almost a century, The Granada Theatre is the central coast's premier performing arts venue. Located in the heart of Downtown Santa Barbara, The Granada is home to eight resident companies and serves as a venue for regional and national touring productions. Featuring a new custom sound system and an all-digital, 4K HD resolution cinema system in addition to outstanding natural acoustics, The Granada Theatre offers a state-of-the-art, world-class production experience with every performance.

# HISTORY

In 1997 the Santa Barbara Center for the Performing Arts (SBCPA) began a two-year exploration of potential performing arts center sites in Santa Barbara. After commissioning and reviewing several feasibility studies, the SBCPA board concluded that renovating a downtown theater was a better alternative than building an entirely new performing arts center. The SBCPA board settled on The Granada Theatre as the ideal site for several reasons — its downtown location, excellent natural acoustics, and the opportunity to undertake a restoration rather than the far more expensive creation of a completely new structure.

The main goal of The Granada Theatre restoration project was to create an extraordinary performance hall that would meet or exceed the needs of the Santa Barbara region's performing arts companies for the next century. Input was solicited from Santa Barbara's premier performing arts companies regarding what technical and structural enhancements of the 85-year-old grande dame structure would be required for each to make The Granada Theatre their permanent home.

The Santa Barbara Symphony required better natural acoustics, a significantly wider proscenium arch, and a stage with a shell and wing space. Opera Santa Barbara required a wider proscenium as well as a much deeper stage. State Street Ballet needed a flexible floor to help protect dancers' physical well-being. UCSB Arts & Lectures needed all the above plus lighting and sound reinforcement technology consistent with the needs of contemporary touring dance and music attractions. All eight companies were unanimous in their expressed desire for more, and better, dressing rooms.

Based on the feedback from the eight organizations that would become The Granada Theatre's resident companies the renovation's scope was intentionally expanded to ensure that all the resident companies' needs would be met. This required the removal of the existing stage house and the construction of an entirely new building that was then attached to The Granada Theatre's historic and familiar façade.

Moving in this direction guaranteed that the SBCPA board would create one of the finest performing arts venues on California's Central Coast — a facility blessed with state-of-the-art updated electrical systems, lighting systems, a new fly system, contemporary audience amenities, large and up-to-date dressing rooms, and new restrooms — all for the benefit of the



resident companies and the region's discerning arts patrons.

In 2005, with work on the project already underway, the SBCPA was informed that a seismic retrofit of the historic site would now be required. Accordingly, costly changes to the original design were made and resulted in a structure which would protect theatergoers in the event of even a major earthquake. The SBCPA board pursued an aggressive effort to complete the project by Spring 2008 for the benefit of the resident companies and the community. The decision to expedite construction, together with a world-wide increase in the cost of raw building materials — particularly

structural steel, copper and cement — increased project costs.

Despite these many changes in the project's scope, the SBCPA Board's findings that a restoration project would result in an exemplary building at a cost far less than would be the case with new construction proved true.

On April 9th, 2008 the beautifully restored Granada Theatre reopened to the community. The Santa Barbara Center for the Performing Arts, with the support of many generous individuals and businesses, has ensured that future generations will inherit a beautiful Santa Barbara landmark — a theatre combining the charm of the past with the cutting edge technological features patrons expect.

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## ABOUT THE COMPANY

State Street Ballet, founded in 1994, is an internationally acclaimed dance company based in Santa Barbara, CA under the bi-coastal artistic direction of Rodney Gustafson and William Soleau. It is a pioneering collaborative that employs dancers from around the world, consistently striving for new and innovative artistic opportunities that serve a broad audience. Each season is dedicated to bringing the highest standards of artistry and originality to tried and true classical favorites, plus new works that reflect the contemporary nature and talent of the ensemble. The company is comprised of 20 dancers representing seven different countries.

Choreographers whose works have been performed by State Street Ballet include Robert Battle, Autumn Eckman, Kevin Jenkins, Gina Patterson, Peter Pucci, Margo Sappington, Kassandra Taylor Newberry, Edgar Zendejas, and the legendary Agnes de Mille and George Balanchine. Visionary new works draw from a team of resident choreographers including Artistic Directors Rodney Gustafson (*The Nutcracker, Cinderella, Romeo & Juliet*) and William Soleau (*Carmen, An American Tango, Carmina Burana*).

State Street Ballet values artistic collaborations and arts outreach opportunities, and is committed to enriching all communities, large and small. Inspiring future generations and reaching a broader, more diverse audience is consistently a priority. Successful collaborations with the Santa Barbara Symphony, Opera Santa Barbara, Music Academy of the West, and the Santa Barbara Choral Society have become very popular and much-anticipated Santa Barbara traditions.

State Street Ballet tours both nationally and internationally, boasting a 90% rebooking rate, rave reviews, and standing ovations from coast to coast. In 2015, the company embarked on a

nine-week tour throughout China, performing Beauty and the Beast in 25 different cities, and the summer of 2017 brought the company an invitation to perform at the International Ballet Gala in Santiago, Chile, showcasing the versatility of the repertoire and dancers. Annual tours across the United States have allowed the company the opportunity to fulfill its mission of making the beauty and power of dance accessible to all.

(Executive and Artistic Director) founded State Street Ballet in 1994 after a successful performing career with American Ballet Theatre.

He holds Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Business Administration and Organizational Management, and combining these skills with the experiences of a performing career has allowed him to build a successful ballet company respected for its versatility, artistic excellence, and intelligently-designed productions. His innovative approach, mastery of the classics, and business savvy have empowered State Street Ballet to become an internationally acclaimed dance company that tours throughout the world

As a dancer with American Ballet Theatre, Mr. Gustafson worked with many of the greatest dancers and choreographers of the time, including Mikhail Baryshnikov, Alvin Ailey, George Balanchine, Rudolph Nureyev, Jerome Robbins and Anthony Tudor. He appeared in the films *The Turning Point* and Baryshnikov's *Nutcracker*, and performed in several Live from Lincoln Center specials airing on PBS. During his tenure as Artistic Director of State Street Ballet, Mr. Gustafson has created many original full-length ballets for the company, including *The Nutcracker, Romeo and Juliet,* 



Cinderella, A Midsummer Night's Dream, and The Jungle Book.



WILLIAM SOLEAU (Co-artistic Director and Resident Choreographer) has created over 100 ballets on companies around the world. As a principal dancer and resident chore-

ographer with several companies, he performed in over 30 countries while personally working with such notable choreographers as Alvin Ailey, John Butler, Toer van Schayk, Antony Tudor, Joyce Trisler, Gray Veredon and Norman Walker. His works can be seen in the repertories of Ballet BC, Shanghai Ballet of China, Ballet de Montreal, Ballet Austin, The Icelandic Ballet, Richmond Ballet, American Ballroom Dance Theater, Ballet Florida, Sarasota Ballet, Dance Kaleidoscope, Ballet Met, Ballet NY, and The Louisville Ballet, among many others. Besides concert work, he has also created choreography for Film, Theater and Opera. As Resident Choreographer at State Street Ballet over the past two decades he has produced such popular productions as An American Tango, Appalachian Spring, Carmen, Carmina Burana and Starry Night. Mr. Soleau was the recipient of the Choo San-Goh Award for Choreography in 2006.

He presently serves as the Executive Director for the John Butler Foundation, Inc., dedicated

to preserving and protecting the master works of this influential American Choreographer. He is also the film editor for the Antony Tudor Ballet Trust. Mr. Soleau is a graduate of Amherst College and was named Co-artistic Director of State Street Ballet in 2018.



TIM MIKEL (Managing Director) is a Founding Member of the State Street Ballet Board, was Board President for thirteen years, and has been Managing Director of the

company since 2007. He has danced professionally and semi-professionally for Plexus Dance Theatre, Channel Islands Ballet, and Pacific Coast Ballet, among others, and continues to attend ballet class daily. He is a professional Marine Biologist involved in water pollution research, and is the President and Owner of Aquatic Bioassay and Consulting Laboratories in Ventura. Mr. Mikel holds both a Bachelor's and Master's Degree in Marine Biology.

**LEILA DRAKE** (*Director of Communications*) is from Santa Cruz, CA, and graduated from UC-Santa Barbara with a double major in Art History and Film Studies. She joined State Street Ballet in 2005 and performed in nearly every production in the company's repertoire, including the principal roles in *Carmen, An American Tango, Carmina Burana, Appalachian* 

Spring, and Scheherazade. This is her 6th season with State Street Ballet. 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
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
